CARERS OF EPSOM CELEBRATES 20 YEARS

It was just 20 years ago that two local residents, Margaret Leatherby and Pam Walters decided to form a small support group for carers in Epsom, Ewell and Banstead. Today, that organisation has become an incorporated charity with 8 staff, supporting more than 500 registered carers and former carers with the help of funding from Surrey County Council and Surrey Primary Care Trust.

The anniversary was celebrated on 11th Jun with a lunch at Ewell Court House, attended by some 80 carers, staff, volunteers and special guests including Deputy Mayor of Epsom & Ewell Cllr Jean Steer, and Borough Council chief executive David Smith.

Paying tribute to the founders of the charity, trustee board chair Cynthia Gifford said: “if it had not been for the determination of Margaret and Pam twenty years ago, this organisation would not exist today”.
